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## Charge to the Mobile Source Committee to Pursue Potential Strategies for Regional Attainment of Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standards

The Ozone Transport Commission (OTC) directs the Executive Staff and the OTC Mobile Source Committee to perform technical analyses to help OTC states develop legally supportable, cost-effective strategies to achieve emissions reductions of ozoneforming pollutants from mobile sources and satisfy Clean Air Act requirements. The goal is to identify potential strategies for consideration by the OTC.
