 - ➤ Helpful last time but room for improvement





Visibility Data Workgroup

Cross-Committee Efforts

- ➤ Joint OTC MANE-VU comments on EPA's Proposed Rule Control of Air Pollution from New Motor Vehicles: Heavy-Duty Engine and Vehicle Standards
 - > TSC comments emphasized the importance of reducing nitrates to reduce secondary particle formation and improve visibility
- Residential Wood Combustion
 - TSC Co-Chair is participating in OTC SAS/NESCAUM efforts to examine and improve inventory EFs, including those for residential wood

- Near-Term Focus Areas

Monitor visibility trends, including those needed for 5-year progress reports (NOTE: PRs due in 2025, work may need to begin as early as 2023)

Near Term Focus Areas

- ➤ Continue Inter-RPO discussions, particularly those related to base year inventories (will require coordination with OTC)
- Track research on impacts of emission reductions and changing atmospheric chemistry on effectiveness of future haze measures
- > Cooperatively leverage resources and activities with OTC and NESCAUM to:
 - a. Provide multi-pollutant perspective of co-benefits from regional haze measures;
 - b. Examine winter wood combustion contributions to haze; and
 - c. Use remote sensing observations to understand NOx emissions and lifetimes.
