




What do people want when they visit a National Park and Wilderness?

640 wilderness users were shown a list of 73 attributes.
They were asked to rank those attributes...

- Clear flowing streams
- Open Spaces
- Wildflowers
- Dirty campgrounds
- Bears, mosquitoes
- Rock slides

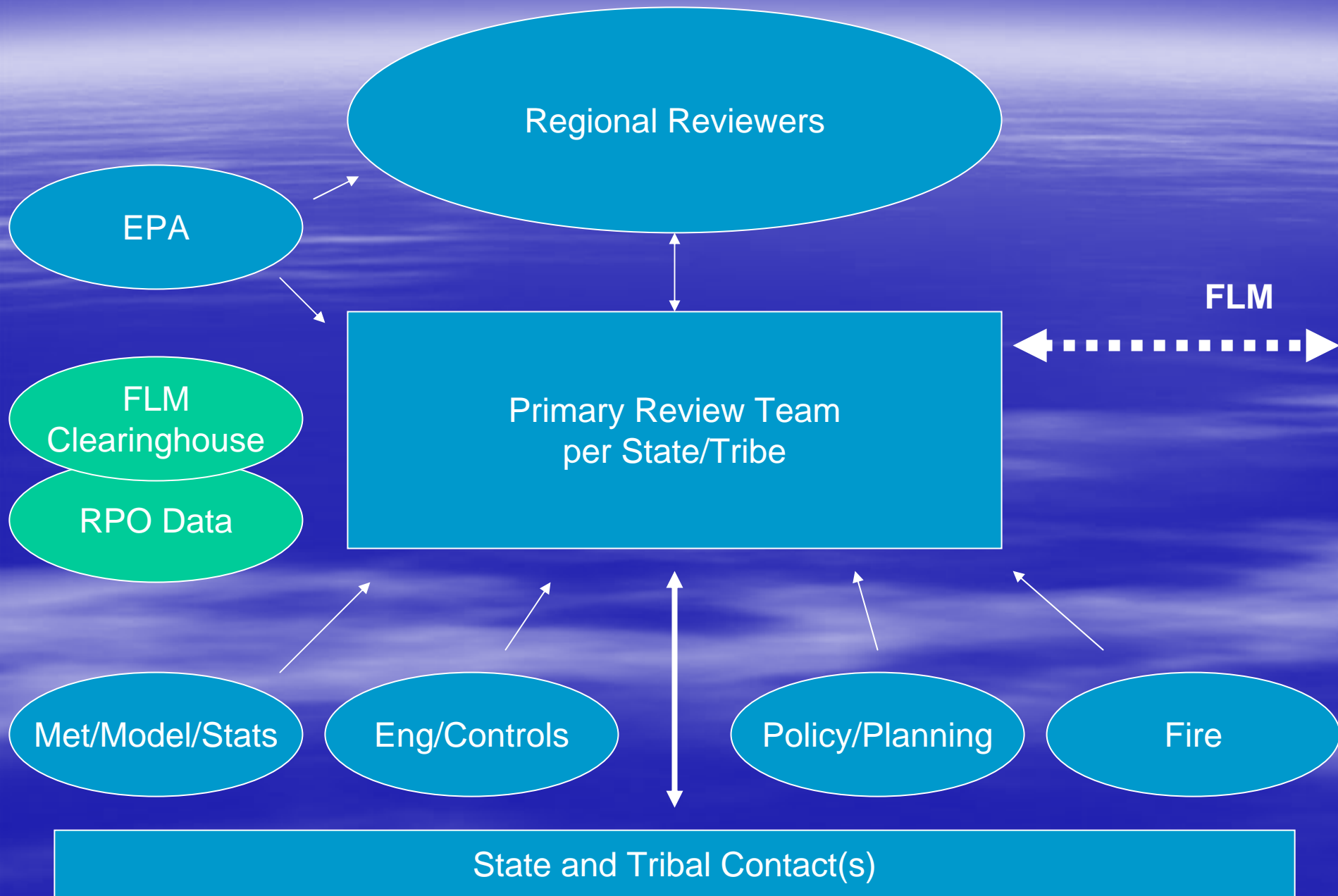
Visibility – Our Most Visible Legacy

- Focus on individual interpretation.
- Emphasis on success.
- FLM role?

Bart Determination

- List of eligible sources.
- *Exemption process.*
- The determination.
 - Available technology
 - Costs of compliance
 - Energy and non-air environmental impacts
 - Control equipment currently in use
 - Remaining useful life of the facility
 - Degree of visibility improvement
 - Implementation (5 years)
- We only have one chance at BART.

Reasonable Progress

- Baseline.
- Natural Conditions.
- Calculation of Goal.
 - Old and New equation
 - Uniform or Reasonable
 - The DEMONSTRATION
 - Reasonableness of goal; analyze and determine rates for each Class I area; show minimal progress for each Class I area; and what if the uniform rate is not reasonable.
- 1 vs. 5 year look.

Reasonable Progress cont...

- Technical analysis.
- Emission Inventory.
- Monitoring Strategy.
- Interstate impacts.
- Enforceable limitations.
- References, Appendices, and Technical support.

What about Consistency?

- They don't all have to be the same.
- Is your document consistent with your goal?
 - Consistent content. (common sense test)
 - Are you thinking regionally?
- Are your neighbors supporting you?
 - Contributing SIPs/TIPs.
 - Timing of submittals.

Source Growth

- Regional Haze SIPs/TIPs will have a strong effect on other programs that FLM agencies review.
 - PSD (permits and increment)
 - NEPA / EIS
 - FLAG
- Proposal to update FLAG.

FLM Consultation

- Formal
 - Letter to States and Tribes
 - Contacts names
 - List of goals, interests, and wants
 - FLM Review Guide
 - 60 days prior to public hearing
 - Letter of comments or conclusions
- Informal
 - Phone, e-mail, and meetings
 - Milestones
 - Timing
 - Regional contributions
